In her newly-released book "Air Born," you can join in on a flight through history as Jan Davis relates her father's heroic service and draws connections between his combat missions and her own spaceflights.

Discover the in's and out's of pilot training in the 1940's alongside her father, Ben Smotherman, and bear witness to his harrowing capture, interrogation, and imprisonment at Stalag Luft III. Rejoice with the POW's as World War II finally ends and the prisoners are returned home to continue pursuing their life's goals.

Shadow Jan Davis as she navigates a career characterized by space exploration, scientific experimentation, and phenomenal feats of engineering. And draw inspiration from the intersection of two completely different yet uniquely connected worlds brought together by a common link of family and flying.

Books will be available for purchase and Jan will autograph the books as well.

INCREASE IN 2024 MEMBERSHIP DUES

Membership dues for 2024 are due beginning January 1, 2024, and may be paid by mailing a check, made to MSFC Retirees Association, to: MSFC Retirees Association, P. O. Box 4492, Huntsville, AL 35815, or by paying at the next lunch.

While membership dues have remained constant for many years, and with the increase in administrative costs of newsletter printing and mailings, guest speakers' meals and honorariums, and technical support to the MRA website and honor roll, the Board has reviewed the dues. In addition, while MRA is supporting a UAH Endowed Scholarship, the Scholarship Committee is exploring opportunities to expand scholarships to USSRC Space Camps, Alabama A&M, Drake State, and others. A portion of the additional dues will allow MRA to play a role in funding scholarships to promote space careers for young deserving students. **The Board voted to raise the dues to \$50 per year beginning January 1, 2024.**

Membership in the Association is open to former MSFC and other NASA Center civil service employees. New retirees are automatically offered a free membership for the remainder of the year in which they retire. If retirement occurs after the first day of September, membership will be free for the remainder of the current year and for the entire upcoming year. Spouses of deceased MRA members may attain membership status with membership dues waived.

SPACE EXPLORATION MEMORIAL (GROUNDBREAKING)!!!!!!!!!!



On August 3, the official groundbreaking for the renovation of the Rocket Park, which included the construction of the Space Exploration Memorial, took place at the U.S. Space and Rocket Center. Led by USSRC CEO, Kimberly Robinson, the speakers included Congressman Dale Strong, Madison County Commission Chairman, Mac McCutcheon and MRA Past President Rick Chappell. There were more than 100 people in attendance at the construction site including many MRA members as well as MSFC Acting Center Director, Joseph Pelfrey. The completion date for the memorial and honor roll is set for **March of 2024**.

To date, contributions to the creation of the memorial total \$850,000 of the \$1,000,000 needed to complete the job and the MRA is working with individuals and organizations to reach this goal in the next few months.

MRA SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

Thanks to the members of MRA, over \$18,000 has been provided to local students for university scholarships, internships and attendance at STEM camps since 2015. Membership generosity has helped MRA achieve its goal of providing incentives to deserving students to promote space related careers.

In June, MRA provided support to Oakwood University's Camp Oaks. This year over 60 local K-8 students attended the camp. Camp Oaks is a science, technology, engineering, arts and math camp. Students participated in activities including: optical robots,

mimic robots, electronic birds and a physics-based skateboard park.



MRA has an endowed scholarship at UAH. Areas for additional funding of scholarships are being sought by the MRA Board of Directors to include Alabama A&M, Drake State, and USSRC Space Camp. The MRA Scholarship Committee includes Jim Turner, Chair, and members Gene Goldman and Lybrease Woodard.

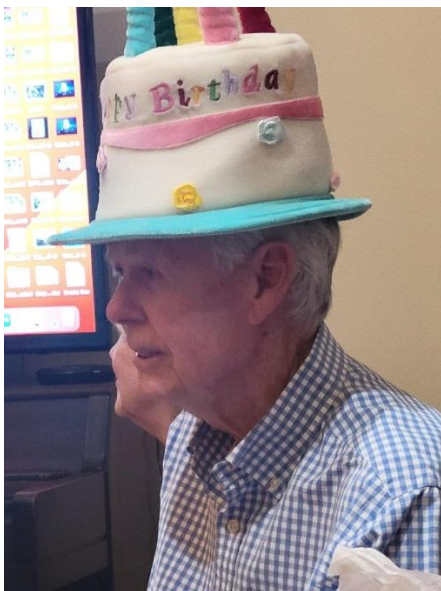
