


PROGRAM SPEAKER:

Dr. Steven Skancke

TOPIC: TODAY'S ECONOMY

Dr. Steven L. Skancke, Ph.D. serves as Chief Economic Advisor, Keel Point Wealth Advisors. Prior to joining Keel Point in 2007, Dr. Skancke was for 24 years a merchant banker based in Washington DC, advising U.S. and international individual, institutional and governmental clients with liquid portfolios of \$50 million to \$200 billion. For the 15 years prior, he served on the White House National Security Council Staff and economic policy teams for Presidents Nixon, Ford, Carter and Reagan. He is also a George Washington University adjunct professor of International Affairs and Economics and the co-author of two books on business productivity and profitability.

SPACE EXPLORATION MEMORIAL AND SPACE EXPLORERS HONOR ROLL



STATUS:

We have reached a major milestone in the creation of the Space Exploration Memorial and its online Space Explorers Honor Roll. After four years of planning, finding MSFC names, designing, and fundraising, we have reached the final phase. An agreement has been signed between Marshall Retirees Association and the USSRC and a contract between the USSRC and Miller and Miller Contractors has been signed to transform the Rocket Park and build the memorial. The contract is expected to be approved by the State of Alabama soon with construction beginning in June. It is very exciting to have reached this stage, and we are indebted to so many people whose support and commitment have brought us to this point.

FUNDRAISING:

MRA members and friends have donated more than \$230,000 and the City, County, and Alabama legislative delegation have donated another \$600,000.

SPACE EXPLORERS HONOR ROLL:

A crucial commitment came early in the process when a group of determined volunteers came together to see if all of the names of the MSFC employees, past and present could be found. Led by Sandra Turner, Gray Settle, Linda Posey and Annette Tingle with help from Barbara Shannon, Shirley Ellis, Janice Young, Jan Zielenski, Ralph Hoodless and Carol Byler, together with "inside" HR help from Jean Payne and Danny Hightower, more than 22,000 names have been found, starting with 11,000 handwritten 5x8 cards and then going through of all of the Marshall phone books.

This personal commitment has taken more than four years and the list is being purged to eliminate duplications and putting them in chronological order of hiring date. This is an incredible gift to all of us!

We will remember Sandra whom we have lost, and we will honor Gray, Annette, Linda and all who have given of themselves and their time. We are also encouraging companies who have partnered with MSFC to add their employees' names to the on line honor roll as well. This is a major accomplishment for history.

SCHEDULE:

The projected time to carry out the memorial is 11 months and the online Space Explorers Honor Roll is expected to be completed in five months so that the engraved plaques can be completed and installed. A kiosk will stand by the memorial to give information on the history of the individuals and the location of their names on the memorial wall.
