Message from the President:

America has returned to the vicinity of the moon with a rocket capable of carrying a crew of astronauts for the first time since 1972, a fifty-year period planning and now beginning to execute the return of astronauts to the lunar surface and this time to stay and explore for much longer times.

The Artemis I flight will be a step toward building a space station in lunar orbit and having crews live there as they transit back and forth from the lunar surface. All of the images that tantalize us about the future flights also cause us to recall the images from the early von Braun rocket team which first showed color sketches of how humans would first leave planet Earth, live in orbit in a space station, travel to the moon and then to Mars, all done 70 years ago and published in Colliers magazine. The visions of the early pioneers are now being realized and the people of the NASA and its partnering contractors are playing a critical central role in making this happen.

This opens yet another chapter in the role of the Huntsville Space Explorers in bringing reality to America's dreams of planetary space exploration for our nation, and many of our MRA members have been part of this great adventure from the beginning up until now!! Thanks to all who have been the "wind beneath our wings"!

Please join us on December 13, 2022, at 11:00 for our last quarterly meeting in 2022, and let's celebrate successes of the past and successes to come.

The Space Exploration Memorial Is Becoming a Reality!!

The support that has come from our individual members and families, our supporting organizations, such as the National Space Club, our Rocket City, Madison County and Alabama legislative delegation, has brought a tremendous burst of funds that has brought us near to our funding goal for the Memorial and accompanying Space Explorers Honor Roll. There have been many individual MRA member contributions as high as 10's of 1000's dollars and 100's of contributions ranging from \$100's to \$1000's. Thanks to all of you!

Thanks also to Mayor Battle and the City Council for the City's multi-year commitment totaling \$250,000, for Chairman Dale Strong and the Madison County Commission's grant for \$300,000 and to Howard Sanderford and Mac McCutcheon's leadership in the Alabama Legislative delegation's grant of \$50,000. This brings our total funding raised to greater than \$750,000 which is the range of the goal that we have set for our MRA fundraising.

The next step will happen on November 29th when USSRC will receive bids from the different contractors who are proposing to build the memorial in the Rocket Park along with the transformation of the park and the replacement of the refurbished rockets. When these bids are in and the contractor is selected, we will know our exact funding needed to begin the construction in the winter months. It has been a pleasure to work with the USSRC leadership and the USSRC Education Foundation, with our government leadership, and with all of you who have made this fundraising success possible. In addition to the donations, Terry Naughton, former Disney artist and animator, has painted a spectacular oil painting of Artemis I on the crawler moving out to the launch pad. We are auctioning the oil painting and selling signed and numbered prints of the painting. We hope you will want to have one of these signed prints for your remembrance of America's return to the moon! (see separate article)

SPOTLIGHT: DR. MELISSA MCGRATH,

MRA BOARD MEMBER

Dr. Melissa McGrath joined the MRA Board in 2021 and has been actively involved in the Space Exploration Memorial Project, including the tasks of locating thousands of MSFC retirees and former employees. Melissa came to Marshall in 2005 as Deputy Director of the Science and Technology Directorate and later served as Chief Scientist until her retirement in 2015. She works part time as a Senior Scientist for the SETI Institute.

Since retirement, Melissa has indulged in two great passions: a love for architecture, with emphasis on Frank Lloyd Wright and interest in genealogy, particularly using DNA results. The passion for architecture started in 2007 while touring Frank Lloyd Wright's Pope-Leighy House in Alexandra, VA. She loves the geometric design, the furniture, the art glass and the blending of the houses into nature. While there, she bought William Allin Storrer's book that catalogs Wright's architecture. That was the beginning of a journey to see all 433 houses contained in the book. To date, it's 300 and counting, from Kansas City, Phoenix, Oklahoma, Pasadena, Iowa, and Wisconsin to name a few. She has been known to trespass on some of the properties.

As Melissa states, working on genealogy is a different kind of thrill because it involves real people. She has been able to locate biological parents for a closed adoption cousin, and locate siblings for a friend. To quote Melissa, "The amazing moment when you realize this is my cousin's mother is a thrill just as exciting as that I've gotten from any discovery in my science career."

Quote from Carl Sagan: "somewhere, something is out there waiting to be known." Melissa states this was her inspiration to become a scientist.

In 1961, the first anniversary of MSFC, the public was invited to tour the facilities. Most had not been behind the gates. Huntsville sponsored a banquet at Ft. Raymond Armory, the largest banquet ever held in Huntsville. The next day at the "Open House," I was crowned the first "Miss Marshall Space Queen, along with two attendants, Carolyn Travis Schrunk and Sandra Baerg. I did not realize I was living in history."





On November 3, 2022, Madison County Commission Chairman Dale Strong presented a grant for \$250,000 to USSRC to support the building of the Space Exploration Memorial. In giving the grant, Strong stated, "There is no better tribute to recognize and honor the thousands of workers from NASA and their contractors whose dedicated teamwork made America's space exploration possible from Huntsville and Madison County as well as all of North Alabama. This memorial will forever recognize these space explorers and serve as an inspiration for generations to follow in their footsteps." This grant is in addition to a \$50,000 grant given in January of 2022.
