INCREASE IN 2024 MEMBERSHIP DUES

Membership dues for 2024 are due beginning January 1, 2024, and may be paid by mailing a check, made to MSFC Retirees Association, to: MSFC Retirees Association, P. O. Box 4492, Huntsville, AL 35815, or by paying at the luncheon on December 12, 2023.

While membership dues have remained constant for many years, and with the increase in administrative costs of newsletter printing and mailings, guest speakers' meals and honorariums, and technical support to the MRA website and honor roll, the Board has reviewed the dues. In addition, while MRA is supporting a UAH Endowed Scholarship, the Scholarship Committee is exploring opportunities to expand scholarships to USSRC Space Camps, Alabama A&M, Drake State, and others. A portion of the additional dues will allow MRA to play a role in funding scholarships to promote space careers for young deserving students. **The Board voted to raise the dues to \$50 per year beginning January 1, 2024.**

Membership in the Association is open to former MSFC and other NASA Center civil service employees. New retirees are automatically offered a free membership for the remainder of the year in which they retire. If retirement occurs after the first day of September, membership will be free for the remainder of the current year and for the entire upcoming year. Spouses of deceased MRA members may attain membership status with membership dues waived.

Update/Status of Space Exploration Memorial

Construction has begun and will include the redesign of the overall Rocket Park, the return of the refurbished rockets that show the history of rocket development in Huntsville by the Army and NASA, and the creation of the Space Exploration Memorial.

The living Memorial Wall will include the engraved names of all MSFC employees, past and present in approximate chronological order of the hiring date. To ensure that your name is included “PLEASE GO ONLINE AND VERIFY THAT YOUR NAME IS IN THE DATABASE AND ADD YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION TO YOUR NAME BY CLICKING ON “VIEW DETAILS.” (www.marshallretirees.org.)

The list of names has already been delivered to Alabama Metal Art, who is now making the engraved panels. The online Space Explorers Honor Roll will be available on a kiosk beside the memorial wall and will have the individual career information and stories as well as the location of your name on the memorial wall.

The completion date of the memorial and the redesigned Rocket Park overall is mid-March 2024. A celebration will follow.

To date, more than **\$950,000** have been raised and we are in reach of our goal. MRA members, other retirees and families as well as the City of Huntsville, Madison County and the Alabama Legislative delegation have been most generous. Individual personal contributions range from \$100 to \$25,000. Thanks to all who have supported this project.

If you have not made a donation, there is a link on the MRA website to make donations which go into a 501(c)3 tax deductible restricted fund for the Space Exploration Memorial in the USSRC Education Foundation.

Mars 2020 mission landed at the U.S. Space & Rocket Center with opening of the “Roving with Perseverance” roadshow in August. The Rocket Center is the only location in the Southeast to host the roadshow, which includes full-size “twin” models of NASA’s Perseverance rover and the history-making Ingenuity Mars Helicopter. The Rocket Center is the first site in the country to receive an enhanced exhibit that includes a model of the Mars Ascent Vehicle.
